Yasemin Ozsavasci was born in 1973 in Germany Munchen, completed her early education in Germany and then moved to Turkey. There she attended Conservatory Music High School where she played several different instruments, including the Cello.

Her artistic inspiration stems from her mother, Yurdagul Ozsavasci, who is one of the most well regarded and famous Ebru artists in Turkey. Yasemin grew up watching her mother making Ebru art every day and it also became her passion. She took the techniques learned from her mother and made them her own. She also draws upon the beauty of nature for many of her paintings.

Ms. Ozsavasci describes the ancient art form this way: "Ebru is a work of love and a paragon of patience. It has been said "You can never step into the same river twice." This is true for Ebru and the Ebru tray. Designs that form from drops of paint on the surface of water are transient. They can never be repeated."

Yasemin Ozsavasci now shares the joy of the Turkish cultural art named Ebru around the world by lessons and demonstrations to artists at heart of all ages and abilities.
