






Sixth graders spell out "Library" on visit to The Edge



SEF is the philanthropic arm of Shinnyo-en, a Buddhist organization with a network of temples and training center


throughout the world including one in White Plains. SEF's mission is to build a more peaceful world by supporting educational programs that engage young people in meaningful acts of community service.

Edge to Offer TV Production Camp for Middle Schoolers




